New appendices summarise medical diagnostic systems, checklists and questionnaires for identifying autism, and the glossary has been considerably expanded. Work adjustment refers to an employee being successful at his/her job and finding satisfaction with his/her work (thus company and job). This book doesn't glamorise work success but makes it realistic and attainable by breaking work success down into concrete steps (meaning concrete actions and/or behaviours). The central premise is to take charge of yourself and of the work environment rather than being a passive participant.

Schwalbe presents a heart-felt and therapeutically tested guide to keeping things in perspective in order to maintain self confidence and self esteem. Most importantly, this book is directed to the aging male baby boomer (and to those who love him, know him, or live with him). It tells him that he is not alone and that the intimate thoughts that he has about his aging body and mind are shared by millions of men who are in their 60s and are dealing with their new age.
