Through a series of interviews conducted with some of Deloitte's largest commercial health plan project teams, representative large program risks were identified that have the potential to affect the scope, cost, quality, and timeline of a project. These major risks were (1) regulatory uncertainty, (2) implementation across multiple stakeholders, and (3) resource availability. The interview methodology included gathering information regarding risks and response techniques from a project management perspective. Interview results showed that effective risk response techniques included contingency planning, detailed traceability of requirements, adoption of an agile implementation approach, a well-defined governance process, and comprehensive communication methods across stakeholders. Risk management is particularly important for HCR programs due to the complexity and evolving regulations and requirements. Failure to implement the required HCR changes on time can result in monetary damages and cause reputational risk to health plans. This white paper introduces recommendations for proactively addressing these risks to decrease their probability and potential effect to a program's success.
