In the first critical book devoted wholly to the series, Julian Lovelock explores each novel in turn, offering an erudite assessment of Ransome's creative process and narrative technique, and highlighting his contradictory politics, his defence of rural England, and his reflections on colonialism and the place of women in society. Thus Lovelock demonstrates convincingly that, despite first appearances, the novels challenge as much as reinforce the pervading attitudes of their time. Written with a lightness of touch and enlivened by Ransome's own illustrations, *Swallows, Amazons and Coots* is both fresh and nostalgic. It will appeal to anyone who has enjoyed the world of *Swallows and*

Amazons, and there is plenty here to challenge both the student and the Ransome enthusiast.
